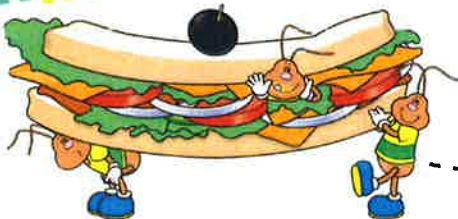
A Note From The Administrator's Desk

Here's a quick update on the removal/replacement of the carpeting in the front entryway of the Manor! It looks like it's going to be done closer to the first part of August as opposed to the end of July, as we anticipated. We do not yet have a confirmed date, but once we do, we may need to communicate this to everyone via Facebook, so please "Like" and "Follow" our Facebook page for updates.

The decision has been made to move from a contracted therapy staff to hiring our own staff, and you will see this change occurring during the month of August. We have hired a Rehab Director, Heather Mortenson, who you may recognize from years past. She worked here through the current rehab company, about 4 years ago, but had since moved on to other opportunities. She is excited to be coming back to Four Winds as the Director of Rehab Services, and we are continuing to build our Therapy team. This will allow us more consistency with staff for treatments, more opportunity for teaching and training of all of our staff on proper body mechanics, lifting & transfer techniques, the use of our mechanical lifts, etc. We are also looking to develop a relationship with a home health agency in order to allow our therapy staff to continue to provide therapy services once a resident is discharged home if the need is there. As our therapy team is built, we will update you with their names, specialities, and provide a little background on them.

We are looking forward to the Family Picnic in August, and hope that Mother Nature will cooperate with us so that we can use the beautiful Courtyard area. If you haven't had an opportunity to go out and appreciate all of the wonderful plants that have been added this year, please take a moment and do so. THANK YOU, PAT for all of the beautiful flowers you have added to the Courtyard.

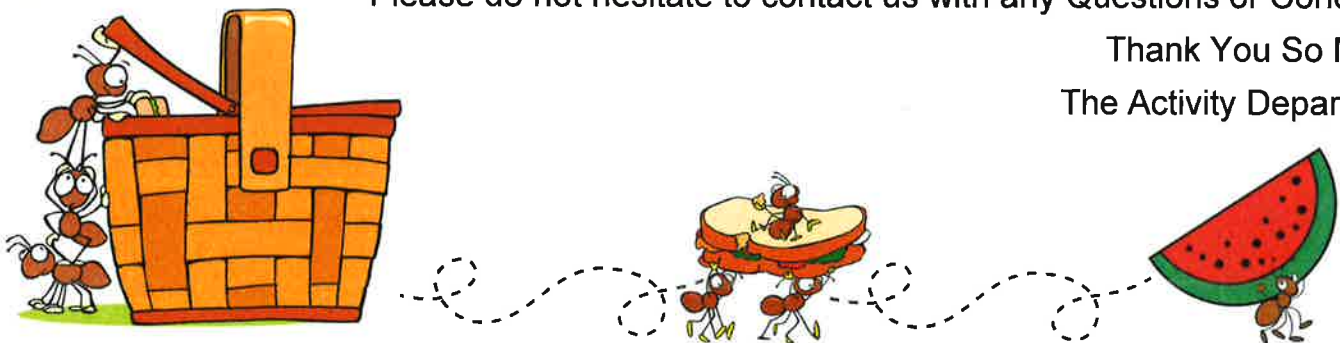

Frances M. Krajco (Leary)

It is with great sadness that we must say goodbye to my mother, Frances Krajco, age 93. She died July 3, 2017, from complications of emphysema. When diagnosed with emphysema 12 years ago she never complained about her disease with which she struggled valiantly. We wish that so much of her life had not been lost to her illness, that things could have been different for her, and for us. We wish that we had more time. She died peacefully with her son, Lee Fischl, and family by her side.

How many people in this world have it so much easier than mom did - how many never faced half the trouble she faced with her emphysema, and yet lose sight so easily of what is truly important. Many of us get distracted by insignificant things in life. Many of us focus on our little problems, and forget about that which is most important.

I hoped that I would never hear the words - your mom has died. They are different than any other words, too big to fit in your ears. Losing a mother is a pain that cannot be described in words. She died - no more visits - no more phone calls, and without realizing my eyes filled with tears. I was sad, at that moment I felt lonelier than I ever felt before in my life.

Have you ever lost someone you loved and wanted one more chance to make up for the time when you thought they would be here forever? My mother and I did have that one more chance.

I was not always the best son and she was not always the best mother. One day I realized I only have one mother, good or bad she is the most special and unique person in our world - I couldn't trade her in! When she moved from Columbus, Ohio, to Verona, Wis., in 1998, we actually learned to like each other and found mother and son love that was missing for many years. The beautiful memories of the times we spent together one day will make me smile. I wish we would have had more time. If you have a mother that is far from perfect - call her and tell her you love her anyway!

Mother retired from an executive position with Lazarus Department Store prior to moving to Verona. Some of the best times of her life were going to her "favorite restaurant" (Lee and Annie's house), visiting and spending time with her sisters, Lenore and Margie, and other friends and family. She had an opportunity to visit Italy with her sister, Margie, in 2005; and spent the winters of 2014 and 2015 in Arizona with Lee and Annie. She also enjoyed doing crossword puzzles, playing cribbage, and watching golf, football and Judge Judy on television.

Even though she is gone, she has left a legacy of love and perseverance. Mom is survived by her son, Lee (Annie) Fischl; two granddaughters, Michelle (Terry) Wilson and Vicki (Bob) Bentley; three great-granddaughters, Amber (Nick) Knoch, Lindsay Wilson and Nicole (Dan) Walchak; and five great-great-grandchildren, Aaron, Elliana, Abigail, and Serena Knoch and Matilda Walchak. She is also survived by her sister, Margaret Duppler, as well as many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her loving husband, Steve; her father and mother, Eugene and Mabel Leary; her brother, Dennett Leary; and her sister, Lenore Wild.

To all the staff at Four Winds Lodge and Manor, many of you brought sunshine and laughter to my mother. We are truly grateful for each one of you and your tender loving care. Thank you so very much for helping make mother's life more comfortable.

God saw you getting tired and a cure was not to be, so he put his arms around you and whispered "come with me." Mother, you and I will meet again, one day in some far off place, so I won't say goodbye Mom, only farewell for you and I will meet again! Somewhere in my heart beneath all my grief and pain, is a smile I will wear at the sound of your name - Mother!

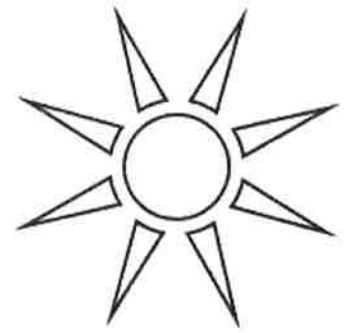
