### A Note From The Administrator's Desk

It's hard to believe it is July already – where have the first 6 months gone??? I hope with July will come some warmer weather so that we can utilize our new front patio a bit more. I will be talking with one of our resident's family members about the possibility of building a pergola out on the front patio to allow for some shade while our residents enjoy the outdoor space. If we can work things out, this could be done yet this summer which would be wonderful!

Now that our remodel has been done for almost a year, we have found out that perhaps carpeting in the front area right outside the main dining room was not the best decision. Unfortunately there are continually numerous stains caused by things being spilled in this area, so we are going to remove the carpeting and replace it with the vinyl plank type flooring we used in the front entrance. This will be done over the next few weeks with the intent it should be completed by the end of July. We will need to schedule this during the overnight hours on 2 consecutive days in order to allow for the removal of the carpeting and glue, leveling of the underfloor, and then placing new glue and the vinyl flooring down. Doing this during the overnight hours will hopefully cause the least amount of disruption to our resident's daily routine. Once we have confirmed dates, we will be communicating this with staff, residents and families as best we can.
